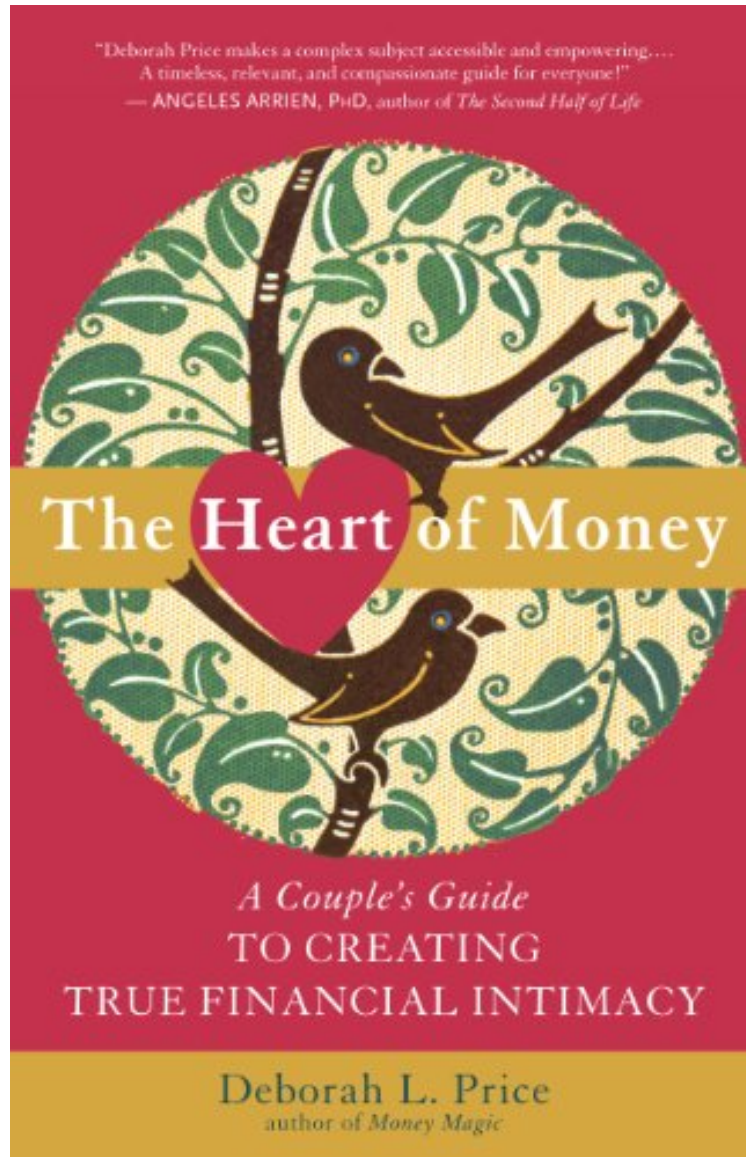

The book has some of the earlier material in condensed form, money archetypes, but expands on how money plays out in relationships. My partner and I are interested in cooperative community, and have been using the rightening of our finances as a couple as our own laboratory for examining the blockages that come up over cooperation. The basics about sharing, setting budgets, living richly while living reasonably below your means, and investing are detailed in this book in ways I haven't seen anywhere else. We've begun some of the unique exercises and are already finding greater courage to make much-needed changes.
